






- Columbus Drive from: Nebraska Avenue to 14th Street











Future Projects – Floribraska Avenue



- Lane reduction from 4 to 2 lanes with a center left turn lane
- Work will include:
 - Bi-directional cycle track
 - Sidewalk improvements
 - Raised pedestrian refuge islands
 - Protected crosswalks at Jefferson Street and Central Avenue
 - LED lighting improvements
- Funded by City of Tampa & FDOT
- Construction to Begin Spring 2023

Work includes pedestrian midblock crosswalks, increasing sidewalk connections, drainage upgrades, lighting improvements, bicycle improvements and landscaping




Southbound I-275 to Eastbound I-4



Safety and operational improvements to the I-275/I-4 interchange

- 1. Southbound I-275 to Eastbound I-4 (FPID 445057-1)
 - Widen existing 1 lane flyover ramp to EB I-4 to 2 lanes
 - Modify exit ramps to Ybor City/East Tampa from 21st/22nd
 Streets to 14th/15th Streets
 - Widen EB I-4 existing frontage road to 2 lanes



1. Southbound I-275 to Eastbound I-4 (FPID 445057-1)


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- Modify exit ramps to Ybor City/East Tampa from 21st/22nd
 Streets to 14th/15th Streets
- Widen EB I-4 existing frontage road to 2 lanes

2. Westbound I-4 to Northbound I-275 (FPID 445056-1)

- Widen existing 1 lane ramp from I-4 to NB I-275 to 2 lanes
- Additional merge lanes on NB I-275 from the interchange to the Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard exit

3. Westbound I-4 to Southbound I-275 (FPID 445056-2)


- Widen 2-lane ramp from I-4 to SB I-275 to 3 lanes
- Widen shoulders on SB I-275 from Palm Ave. to Jefferson St.
- Downtown exit ramp shifted to the west

Shared Use Path and Community Space



Shared Use Path

- 12' wide path
- Widened sidewalks at underpasses (cut back slopes, add gravity walls)
- Low-level solar lighting along path for safety
- Upgraded lighting at all underpasses and road crossings


- Landscaping enhancements and screening
- Aesthetics along interstate to match existing



Community Space Along 14th Avenue Corridor



- Previous Public Comments include: dog park, community garden, fitness equipment and aeriation fountains
- Partnering with the City of Tampa Parks and Recreation Department to maintain the facility
- Community space is included in the Downtown Tampa Interchange project construction
- Options under consideration: dog park, fitness equipment / exercise stations or area, or 3 on 3 basketball court






I-275 Operational and Capacity Improvements Project



Construction Underway

- Project will widen I-275 within the existing right-of-way and add 1 additional lane in each direction
- Wide shoulders will accommodate transit
- Noise barriers
- Aesthetics and pedestrian improvements
- New underpass lighting
- Fencing


Removal of Barrier Wall and Bridge Deck



I-275 Corridor north of Hillsborough Avenue



- Future phase not currently funded for construction
- Widening for 1 additional generalpurpose lane in each direction
- Wide outside shoulders to accommodate Regional Rapid Transit Bus
- Extensive noise barriers
- No Right-of-Way required





City of Tampa Vision Zero Quick Build Program



- The City of Tampa is launching a Quick Build program to address direct safety or mobility challenges in a streamlined, cost-effective way
- Quick Build projects are semipermanent changes to the street that address these challenges that can be rapidly deployed


- Current streets under consideration for Quick Build are:
